Dear Mr. Srinivasan:

Mr. Raymond J. Brienza, Director of Financial Aid at New York University, has informed me that 6 of your 15 credit hours for the fall semester of 1971 are graduate credits.

The H. B. Earhart fellowship for graduate study awarded you on 24 June 1971 was for \$1,500 (or \$750 per semester) for the 1971-1972 academic year. Since 40% of your work will be on the graduate level during the fall semester of 1971, your fellowship stipend will be appropriately pro-rated in the amount of \$300 for this semester. Twenty dollars, rather than one hundred, will be withheld from this amount for reporting compliance as explained in the "Instructions to Recipients of Fellowships."

The amount of your fellowship for the spring semester of 1972 will be dependent upon the number of graduate credit hours which you carry. We will look forward to hearing from you on this matter at the appropriate time.
